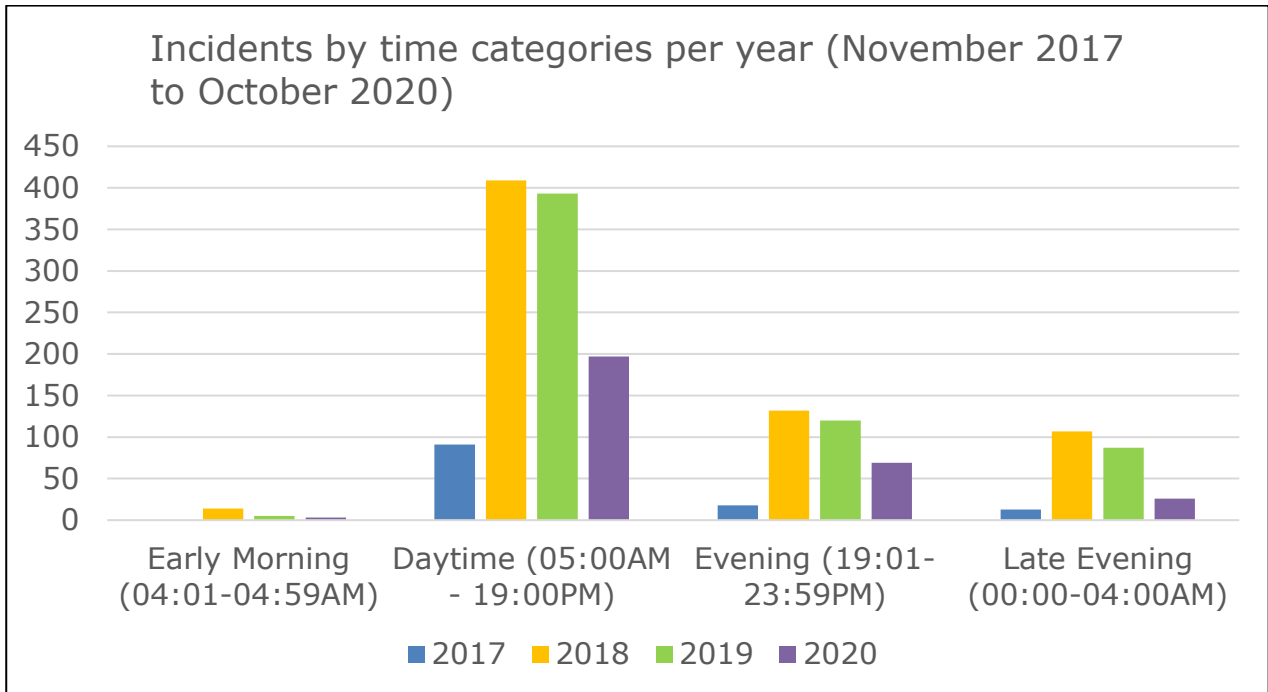


## **Newmarket Cumulative Impact Assessment (CIA) - Crime Statistics (2017-20): Summary crime statistics covering the period 1 November 2017 to 3 October 2020**

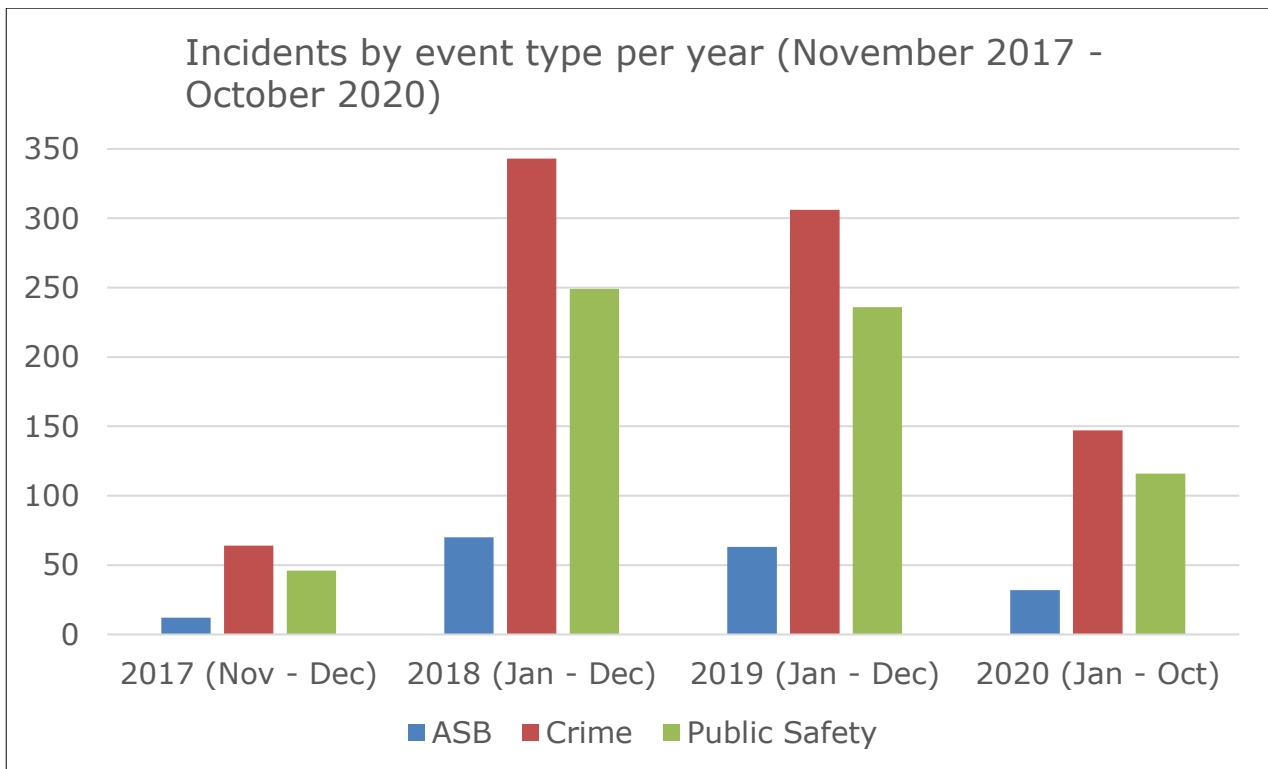
### **Incidents – headline statistics (November 2017 to 2020)**

- **1684 incidents** were recorded within the CIA area between **November 2017 and October 2020**.
- **Newmarket High Street** saw the largest volume of recorded incidents, appearing **1047** times as a recorded location.
- **Palace Street** comparatively only recorded **25** incidents during the same period.
- **65% (1090)** incidents occurred during the **daytime (5am to 7pm)**
- **20% (339)** incidents occurred during the **evening (7.01pm to 11.59pm)**
- **14% (233)** incidents occurred during the **late evening (midnight to 4am)**
- **1% (22)** incidents occurred during the **early morning (4.01am to 4.59am)**
- Throughout all time sectors and each year **Crime** (mainly daytime thefts) was the **most common incident** type recorded accounting for **51% of all incidents recorded each year**.
- **Antisocial behaviour (ASB) incidents** per year remained at similar levels in **2018 and 2019 (recording 70 and 63 incidents respectively)**.
- **2020** was lower (**32**), probably due to lockdown.
- The **top three places** with the **highest number of recorded incidents** were: **Newmarket High Street (1047), Guineas Centre (241) and Fred Archer Way (185)**. Collectively these **places accounted for 87% of all locations of incidents**.
- Between the years 2018 to 2019, the **total number of incidents** recorded decreased by 57 (662 to 605). From 2019 to 2020 the total number of incidents recorded show a **reduction** of 310 (probably due to COVID lockdown).
- During every year, **crime** accounted for the highest number of incidents and **antisocial behaviour** the fewest. The number of crimes reduced by 11% (37 crimes) between 2018 and 2019.
- However, the number of ASB incidents have remained at similar levels during 2018 and 2019 (70 and 63 respectively) with a reduction in 2020 (probably due to COVID lockdown).

- **Public safety** incidents remain at similar levels in 2018 and 2019 (249 against 236), but are significantly higher than those recorded in 2016, 2017 and 2018 (63,75 and 80).
- 65% of all incidents were recorded in the daytime with 34% recorded during the evening and late evening until 4am.



The graph indicates that most incidents occur during day time hours, 5am to 7pm.



The graph indicates that the overall crime rate has been declining since 2018, but is still higher than in 2017.
