Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
  - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
    - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
  - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
    - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption

on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.

- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that

     (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that
     accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

Section M

#### A - General

A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport, or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram. For all orders taken over the phone or via the internet, customers will be informed of Challenge 25 and the requirements to have ID ready for inspection should the need arise before receipt of alcohol beverages.

CCTV already covers the inside and outside of the premises including the entrance.

An incident/ refusals book shall be maintained at the licensed premises, this will be available to an authorised officer of the Police or Licensing Authority upon request.

The incident log will record the following:

- a. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol, along with date, time, reason & staff members name
- b. All crimes reported to the venue
- c. All ejections of patrons and reasons
- d. Any complaints received
- e. Any incidents of disorder
- f. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

Regular staff training will take place regarding the requirements and responsibilities of the Licensing Act 2003, and a record of such training shall be retained at the premises and be made available to the Police or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority upon request.

#### B - The prevention of crime & disorder

A CCTV system is installed at the premises covering the entrance, the external area and all internal areas. Images shall be kept for a minimum of 14 days and supplied to the police or local authority on request.

A member of staff trained in the use of the CCTV system will be always available at the premises when it is open to the public.

The CCTV system will display, on screen and on any recording, the correct time and date that images were captured.

CCTV signage will be displayed, reminding customers that CCTV is in operation.

The premises shall operate a zero-tolerance policy to the supply and use of drugs.

Anyone who appears to be drunk or intoxicated will not be allowed entry to the premises and those who have gained entry will be escorted from the business immediately

Drinking water will be available to all customers.

All delivery orders shall be to a registered residential or business address. There shall be no alcohol deliveries to public/communal areas or open spaces.

#### C - Public safety

Health and Safety Compliance: Regularly conduct risk assessments to ensure the cafe complies with all health and safety regulations, including fire safety, emergency exits, and first aid provisions.

Staff Training: Train staff in emergency procedures, including fire drills and first aid, ensuring they know how to react in case of an incident.

Escape routes and exits will be maintained to ensure that they are free from obstruction and in good order, free from trip hazards and clearly identified.

Sufficient outdoor lighting will be supplied for patrons entering and leaving the premises.

#### D - The prevention of public nuisance

During the hours of operation, the licence holder shall ensure sufficient measures are in place to remove and prevent litter or waste arising or accumulating from customers in the area immediately outside the premises.

Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed at the exit to remind customers to

leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.

There will be regular visits to all parts of the premises including outside areas to monitor the levels of noise from the playing of amplified live and recorded music.

The premises licence holder shall take appropriate measures to ensure that all guests leave the premises in a quiet and orderly fashion, ensuring staff are trained and briefed on how to disperse guests safely and quietly.

No beers, ales, lagers, or ciders of 6% ABV or above to be sold.

#### E - The protection of children from harm

We always ask that children are supervised by an adult at all times.
