Good news that we can continue with just one polling station at All Saints Church. I had a word with Cllr Yarrow about an alternative the Racing Centre. We could only come up with Foley House, which has been used in the past, but this is geographically very close to the Racing Centre so I doubt it would have much impact. The Exning Road Club was also mentioned but I think this already serves as a polling station for the neighbouring ward.

I also note that St Agnes Church serves a very small electorate but has the highest percentage turn out. Does that suggest that a bigger geographic spread of polling stations serving smaller number of voters would improve turnout? I don't suppose that's feasible....

Hi Sue,

Thanks for your reply. I've looked into this a bit more and, whilst we are awaiting the results of the electorate forecast, I suspect that we can continue with 1 polling station at All Saints Church for now as the electorate is 2234 but we have 356 postal voters in this area too so that polling station electorate is 1878 which is manageable as 1 polling station and well within the Electoral Commission limit of 2250. We provide additional staff at polling stations of this size to ensure that voters can access the polling station and vote quickly and easily.

With regard to the use of a school as a polling station, we can and do use some schools where other venues are not available. We work very closely with the school to resolve any safeguarding issues and will provide barriers and other equipment as needed to support the school to remain open and operational on polling day. However, I have looked at a map and I think the Cheveley Road Club may be a better option for future consideration as it is within a separate part of the polling district entirely and the train line provides a good boundary to use as the polling district boundary. I suggest that if the electorate at the All Saints Church polling station is projected to exceed the electorate limit in the future then we split the polling districts with 1 set of electors going to All Saints and the other going to the Cheveley Road Club. So, no change proposed for now but a good option ready for the future. I would welcome your thoughts on this.

I also very much welcome yours and other Cllrs thoughts on the Racing Centre polling station too. It is a good venue but I apricate that there may be another venue which is more appropriate, and your local knowledge would be very helpful.

If I have read the figures correctly, All Saints Church gets a pretty good turn out (23% vs 13% at the Racing Centre). That would suggest that having 2 polling stations at the church would be a good solution. The obvious alternative venue would be All Saints School in Vicarage Road but my guess is that you can't use schools any more because of safeguarding. Would that be correct? The other alternative could be Cheveley Road Working Mens Club on Cheveley Road (W3W water handfuls user). That ward is split by the railway line and the CRWMC is over the other side of it from the church.

I am a bit more concerned about the poor turnout at the Racing Centre. No way of knowing if changing the polling station would improve that. Having said that, I am hard pushed to think of an alternative venue further away from the High Street. I will have a chat with Cllr Yarrow and see if he can think of anything as he lives there.

Thank you for your email. We will be actioning an electorate forecast and as the polling station is so close to capacity it may be sensible to consider alternative options. We have two potential options which I would welcome your views on initially;

- We can carry out a visit to assess whether the All Saints Church could accommodate two separate polling stations. We would then split the streets in the polling district alphabetically between the two polling stations held at the church. This is an approach that we are familiar with.
- We can consider splitting the polling district and creating two separate polling districts. This would be a good option if there is a clear geographical boundary, i.e. two different estates, and a venue in each polling district. The map attached may assist with this.

We would like to invite all members to make representations and comments on the existing and proposed polling districts and polling places. The consultation deadline is 10 November 2023.

The review is designed to see if the polling districts and polling places in West Suffolk suit the needs of voters, and includes:

Polling district boundaries within each ward in the district.

- Location of the polling places and stations in each polling district.
- Access to each polling station.

The aim of the review is to make sure:

- Electors have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances.
- As far as is reasonable and practicable, polling places are accessible to all electors, and consider the needs of disabled persons.
