A successful skills and job fair designed to match Jobseekers with new employment, has been held as the result of a conversation at a Newmarket Vision Equine Hub meeting. The first of its kind in the town, the event was led by Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) and held at the Memorial Hall.

Twenty local employers attended, eager to fill positions they have on offer. Around 130 Jobseekers came and of those who left feedback, the large majority have started the application process, and even have trial shifts arranged.

Cllr Susan Glossop, Cabinet member for Growth at West Suffolk Council said,

"I was really pleased that council officers approached partners at DWP about running the event after a conversation about skills at Newmarket Vision. It is easier than ever to increase your skills for free, and the local employers and training providers attending is proof of the opportunities available. I am delighted the initiative has been so well supported."

Further events are being planned.

- The Government has invited employers to help to get 500,000 Jobseekers working by the end of June 2022 through the <u>Job Health Way to Work campaign</u>
- This is supported by <u>GOV.UK Plan for Jobs</u> a package of skills, employment and support programmes for Jobseekers at all levels, including free training places, qualifications, traineeships and apprenticeships.

# Skills and Jobs Fair proves popular

- You can increase your skills for free from the comfort of your own home through online learning. <u>GOV.UK The Skills Toolkit</u> gives free digital courses to help you progress in work and boost your job prospects. There are more than 70 high-quality courses in digital, numeracy and employability skills, complete with support from some of the country's leading educational experts and employers. And if you are 19 or over and don't yet have A levels or equivalent, you can now take your first Level 3 qualification for free. Or chose from the hundreds of free courses linking to jobs in sectors such as building and construction, health and social care, accounting, engineering, environmental conservation and more.
- Locally there are many opportunities for employers and Jobseekers, including part and fully-funded training, listed on the <u>West Suffolk Council</u> <u>Skills</u> webpage. This includes offers specific to West Suffolk as well as the support and opportunities on offer over a wider geography delivered by a host of partner organisations such as the Apprenticeships Suffolk' and Youth Pledge for Employers' services delivered by Suffolk County Council.

To celebrate the Platinum Jubilee year, Discover Newmarket has created two new tours. The Racing Royalty Tour is a guided walk detailing the town's strong Royal connections and includes a visit to Palace House. They have also launched a series of Royal Yard Tours visiting three trainer's yards where her Majesty has horses in training with John and Thady Gosden, William Haggas and Michael Bell. The generous support of Newmarket's Trainers in facilitating these tours is once again helping to raise the profile of the home of horseracing.

They are working with the Festival of Suffolk to pull together the county's Jubilee celebrations as well as attending the Cambridgeshire County Racing Day to promote the Home of Horseracing.

They are currently developing a new Careers and Education section on their website providing a signposting service for visitors interested in seeking a career in racing. And they are working on a new Conference Venue page promoting the town's diverse meeting spaces and encouraging business visits.



The Love Newmarket **Business EXPO** welcomed many local businesses to the first event of its kind at the Bedford Lodge Hotel. Commenting on the event, Tracey Hayes from exhibitors Everything Answered said: "Being the first business fair to be held in Newmarket for a very long time, I suspect that the majority of stand holders were very unsure of what to expect. However, you blew us out of the water – the buzz in the room, the number of visitors and the amazing organisation was a credit to all the hard work which goes on behind the scenes of any event such as this.

Jockey Club seeks to play its part in Newmarket's future

The Jockey Club has adopted a new approach and started a conversation with the community in Newmarket about how it can help to shape the future of its historic home.

A community drop-in event - "Playing our part in Newmarket's future" – was held at The King Edward VII Memorial Hall in the town's High Street. Visitors were taken on a journey from the Jockey Club's origins in 1750, to its involvement in the community and its contributions today, along with its ideas for how Newmarket can grow sustainably, balancing the needs of the local residents, visitors, businesses and their employees.

Some of the concepts for discussion included a country park, a cinema, an allweather training and racing facility and the potential for residential development.

Amy Starkey, the Managing Director for the Jockey Club's East Region, explained why the organisation is taking this approach. She said: "West Suffolk is considering a vision and Local Plan for Newmarket for the next 20 years. Newmarket has always been our home and we want to play our part in helping Newmarket to thrive over that time.

"Therefore we're exploring some initial ideas for the future that could bring benefits to local people and the town as a whole. We want to share those ideas and hear what people have to say at an early stage before deciding if they have merit in exploring further.

"It's important to make clear that these are just ideas for future sustainability and there are no timelines, proposals or plans for any of this to come to fruition.

"Everyone will have their chance to feed in, whether in person or online, and we're looking forward to an open and constructive discussion with the town."
