

# Notice for all residential permit holders Bury St Edmunds

**25 December 2020 until further notice**

West Suffolk Council has agreed following the government announcement of the latest lockdown period to allow residential permit holders (all zones) free parking in all off-street car parks.

## **Car parks where you can park for free when displaying a valid residential permit**

Residential permits **are valid** in any West Suffolk Council off-street car park using your valid residential permit:

- Arc/Cattle Market car park
- Bury Leisure Centre car park
- Lower Baxter Street car park
- Parkway Multi Storey car park
- Parkway Surface car park
- Ram Meadow car park
- School Yard East and West
- St Andrews Flexi and long stay car park.

## **On-street locations where you are unable to park using your residential permit**

Residential permits **are not valid** for on-street parking areas. You cannot park using your residential permit in these areas:

- Abbeygate Street
- Angel Hill
- Buttermarket
- Chequers Square
- Churchgate Street
- Cotton Lane
- Guildhall Street
- Hatter Street
- Looms Lane
- Lower Baxter Street
- Town Centre
- Whiting Street.

Residential permits **are not valid** in West Suffolk Council country parks:

- Brandon Country Park
- Clare Castle Country Park
- Hardwick Heath Country Park
- Nowton Park Country Park
- West Stow Country Park and Anglo-Saxon Village.

## **Terms of use for residential parking in off-street car parks**

You can park 24 hours a day until further notice. As long as your residential permit is valid and clearly on display.

## **Use of visitor vouchers in off-street car parks**

You are able to use a visitor's voucher within an off-street car park, however it must be valid and all relevant information filled out correctly for the date in use.

## **Use of Blue Badge instead of residential permit**

Blue Badge holders are unable to use their badge instead of a permit, if parking is required displaying a blue badge then charges apply.

## **Scheme end date**
