



**REFERENDUM STATEMENT –
HARGRAVE NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN**

A Referendum is to be held on **12 July 2018** in Hargrave village hall. The question to be asked at the Referendum is:

“Do you want St Edmundsbury Borough Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Hargrave to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”

The **Referendum Area** is the same as the Neighbourhood Area:



The **Referendum expenses** limit in relation to the Referendum is £2362.14 which has been calculated on the basis of 235 electors.

The **persons entitled to vote** in the referendum are those who:

- Are entitled to vote in an election of a councillor to St Edmundsbury Borough Council, and
- Have a qualifying address for the election in the referendum area.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures similar to those used at local government elections.
