

## Town & Country Planning Act 1990 Neighbourhood Planning Regulations (General) Regulations 2012 (As amended)

On 10 January 2019 Great Barton Parish Council applied to St Edmundsbury Borough Council to designate the whole of the Great Barton Parish boundary as a Neighbourhood Area for preparing a Neighbourhood Plan.

The application was made under Regulation 5 of the above regulations.

Regulation 5A states that ... "where (1)(a) a local planning authority receives an area application from a parish council" and (1)(b) the area specified in the application consists of the whole of the parish council's area, (2) the local planning authority must exercise their powers under section 61G of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 to designate the specified area as a neighbourhood area."

Regulations 6 and 6A relating to publicising an area application do not apply in this instance. Therefore, in accordance with Regulation 5A(2) and 7(1) of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (as amended) St Edmundsbury Borough Council hereby give notice that it has designated the parish of Great Barton as a Neighbourhood Area in order to facilitate the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan by Great Barton Parish Council.

Under Regulations 6a and 7 of the above regulations (as amended) and following the statutory consultation period, the Council has designated the application area as a Neighbourhood Area in order to facilitate the preparation of a Neighbourhood Plan by Great Barton Parish Council.
