

## **Newmarket Neighbourhood Plan information statement**

**Town & Country Planning Act 1990 Schedule 4B (as varied by s38A & 38C of the Town and Country Planning Act) Neighbourhood Planning (Referendums) Regulations 2012 (as amended)**

A referendum relating to the Newmarket Neighbourhood Plan will be held on **Thursday 30 January 2020**.

The question to be asked at the referendum is: **Do you want West Suffolk Council to use the Neighbourhood Plan for Newmarket to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?**

The **referendum area** is identical to the area which has been designated as the Newmarket Neighbourhood Plan Area. See below.

The **persons entitled to vote in the referendum** are those who:

- Are entitled to vote in an election of a councillor to West Suffolk Council
- Have a qualifying address for the election in the referendum area.

The referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £3066.52 which has been calculated on the basis of 11,941 electors.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures similar to those used at local government elections.

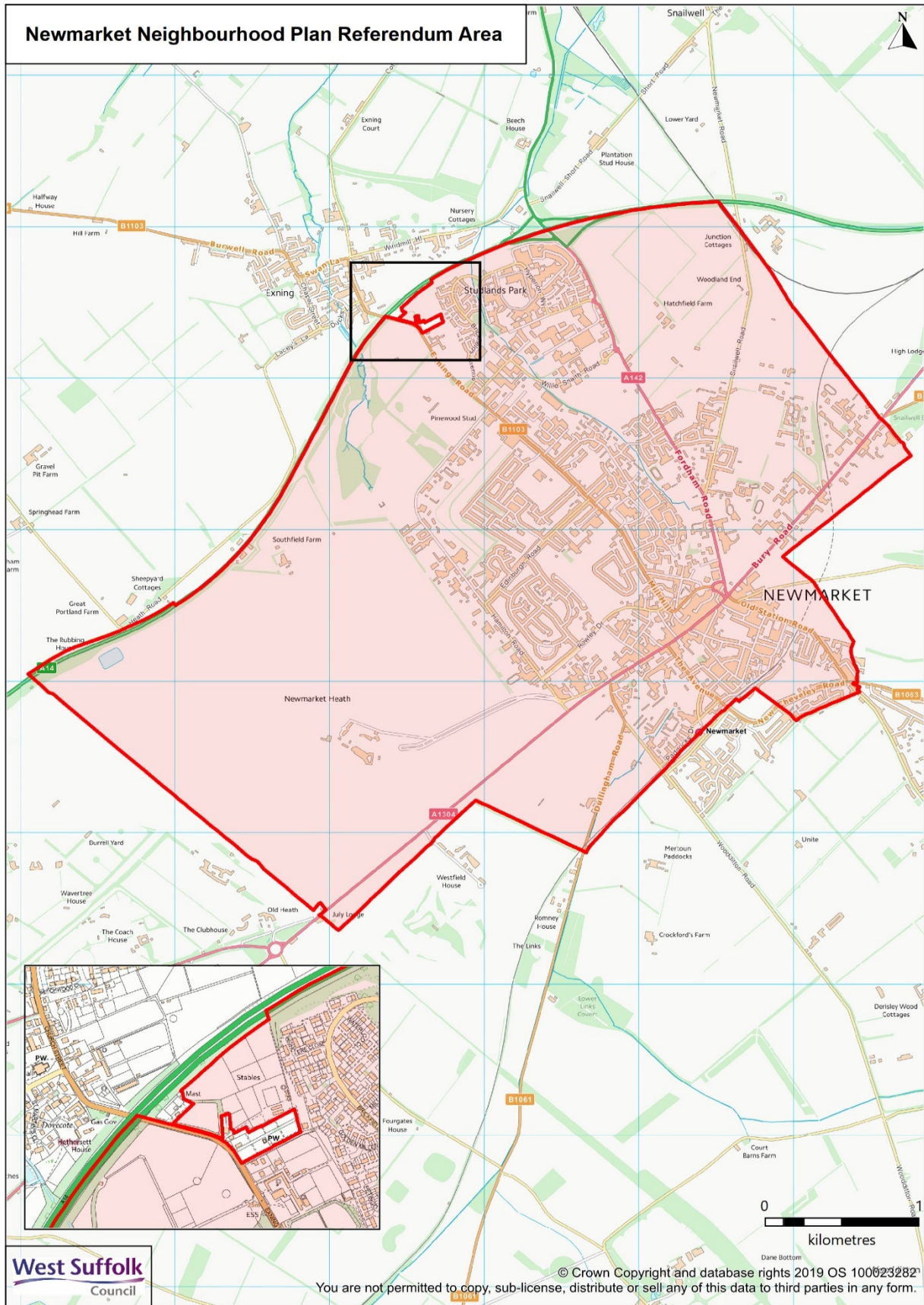
